The Minister of Foreign Affairs of Turkmenistan and the Deputy Prime Minister of Afghanistan held an online meeting

Deputy Prime Minister of Afghanistan Abdul Ghani Baradar held a videoconference meeting with the Minister of Foreign Affairs of Turkmenistan Rashid Meredov, the Embassy of Afghanistan in Turkmenistan reports on its social networks.

In addition, he mentioned Turkmenistan's readiness to invest in Afghanistan's electric power and railway infrastructure.

The Deputy Prime Minister of Afghanistan noted that the two countries will continue to work together on a number of joint issues in various fields in order to maximize the opportunities created for both countries.

In conclusion, Rashid Meredov invited Abdul Ghani Baradar to visit Turkmenistan at an appropriate time.
