

However, as emphasized by a Samsung representative at a recent press briefing, work on the Exynos 2600 continues, and the company does not plan to abandon this product. No timelines for the market release or even an announcement of this platform were provided.

According to the source, contrary to rumors, there are no indications of issues with the 2nm manufacturing process. Nevertheless, even if Samsung has production problems, it apparently does not prevent the vendor from working on this chipset and preparing it for future devices.

Currently, there are rumors that the Exynos 2600 will be used in the Galaxy S26 series. If this turns out to be true, it is still unclear whether it will be used in all models or only in certain regions.
