

A simple way to find out how much money you've spent on Steam games over time has been discovered

Gamers on Reddit recalled a hidden page on Steam where you can see your total expenses over time.

It's done in just a few clicks: Help → Steam Support → My Account → Data associated with your Steam account → External Funds Used. The 'TotalSpend' field will display the total amount in dollars—even if you paid in rubles.

Some users discovered that they had spent tens of thousands of dollars on their game libraries. On average, users' spending ranges from a few hundred to several thousand dollars. They also recalled common discount traps: "The game only cost \$1, but in the end, it added up to multiple mortgages."

External Funds Used

This is a sum of external funds that have been applied to your Steam account, either to purchase or calculate only when needed and are not always current. If the values are not presented in the table, you can find a list of your purchases at <https://store.steampowered.com/account/history>. "TotalSpend" is the amount of external funds applied to your account to determine if an account is a "Limited User Account". "OldSpend" is the amount of external funds applied to your account to calculate the "OldSpend" value. "PWSpend" is the amount of external funds applied to your account to calculate the "PWSpend" value. "ChinaSpend" is the amount of external funds applied to your account to calculate the "ChinaSpend" value. "PackageOnlySpend" is the amount of external funds applied to your account to calculate the "PackageOnlySpend" value.
