

The Neowin portal reports that Microsoft for some reason removed (or froze) from the development of the Copilot and Teams Sisteman screen. The function was to help AI assistant better understand what is happening on the screen during video calls in Teams. This was supposed to make answers and Copilot advice more accurate.

Recently, Microsoft has updated information about this Copilot function in its development plan. Now the company cannot start this function in the near future. The developers apologized to users and transferred the launch to August 2026. It is noteworthy that this function is in the spirit of "understanding AI", on which work boils and which Microsoft managers have been talking about many times in recent years.

However, the reasons for such a decision are still unknown. According to observers, this may be due to security issues: the company may not want Copilot to have access to everything that happens on the screen, even if it improves its work.

It is noted that the similar function has already been implemented in tests of Windows 11. It is called Copilot Vision and allows Copilot to see the desktop in real time. But this is another function. You can run it through the Copilot application.
