

On 18 December 2025, the Heydar Aliyev Center in Azerbaijan's capital Baku hosted the opening ceremony of the creative exhibition by Peruvian artist Sol Alexo, entitled "Imaginary World Between the Andes and the Caucasus."




## International Exhibition "Imaginary World Between the Andes and the Caucasus" Opens in Baku
