

Brussels — Ambassadors of Central Asian countries and Mongolia met with [Peter De Roover](#), Speaker of the Belgian House of Representatives. The meeting was regarded as a new stage of regional cohesion and international cooperation.



Speaking on behalf of Turkmenistan, the ambassador emphasized that Central Asia today is one of the most stable and trust-based regions in the world. He noted that the countries of the region consistently develop joint approaches to all major issues.

- Transport and logistics — new corridors between Europe and Central Asia
- Energy — sustainable sources and new technologies
- Climate — joint measures against climate change
- Education and culture — cooperation among youth, universities, and creative communities

At the conclusion, both sides reaffirmed their mutual interest in expanding parliamentary dialogue and broad cooperation.
